


Large-scale mining is facing fundamental challenges

Assess gaps /challenges preventing increased participation of women in mining and supply chains



Assess impacts of global trends for women in mines and in supply chains

Provide guidance and technical support to address gender inequality and harness opportunities

Data collection

Improve gender-segregated data collection and analysis on mining occupation, skills and job profiles.

Access to better jobs

Support women to have access to better job opportunities in the mining sector and in supply chains.

Challenges addressed


Overcome challenges faced by women to access current and future employment in the large-scale mining sector



PHASE I JULY 2021 – APRIL 2022

Getting the data right about existing profiles of women in LSM



Baseline data collection

Collect genderdisaggregated data on:

- Employment
- Occupation
- Skills and levels of education



Analysis

- Data collected
- Countries' regulatory frameworks/ policies
- Good practices from companies
- Challenges and gaps, including on data



Policy recommendations

 Provide policy recommendations to improve participation of women

- Suggestions to improve data collection



Cross-country comparison

A Global Report will compare results and draw lessons from the 11 countries to improve global dialogues and incountry support
